"We are very pleased to say that MOPS LogBook is now rolled out in all departments and this provides a great possibility to give important information via the MOPS system to the right users", says Per Pettersson, IT department, Smurfit Kappa Kraftliner.



Some benefits to mention are important information from one shift to next is easily provided via the system. Reports are generated in the web browser that can be accessed via the mill intranet. Management can quickly and easily keep track of production losses, the reason and actions taken, and all users in the mill can follow key performance values calculated by LogBook, i.e. OEE.

MOPS LogBook helps Smurfit Kappa Kraftliner in Piteå, Sweden, to streamline workflow and sharpen effectiveness in daily work all over the mill. LogBook is the central repository where all operators keep track of production losses and events. Identified production losses generate exceptions automatically and the operators can analyze and make effective decisions based on the information. All maintenance tasks are today initiated in Logbook and forwarded to the maintenance system. Status and actions of the task from the maintenance system are presented back in LogBook.



Oracle 11gRelease 2

Eurocon MOPSsys can now offer the MOPS product with support for the Oracle 11gR2 database. MOPS currently supports Oracle 9i, Oracle 10g and Oracle 11g but please note that Oracle 9i is no longer supported on new installations. Support for Oracle 11gR2 will be available in November 2010.


User Account Control (UAC)

The launch of Windows Vista, Windows 7, and Windows Server 2008 offer a new technology and security infrastructure named User Account Control (UAC). It aims to improve the security of Microsoft Windows by limiting application software to standard user privileges until an administrator authorizes an increase or elevation.

MOPS client applications will in version 13.2.1 be adapted to conform to this new security infrastructure. This will involve new installation packages that requests security elevation when needed. These new installation packages will also simplify use in deployment servers and repackaging tools. MOPS applications have been updated to comply with UAC practices which in most cases mean storing configuration and data in folders accessible to non-privileged users.
